### Summary

Multi stakeholder and cross-sectoral partnerships are key to successful implementation of the Strategic Plan of UN-Habitat in advancing the 2030 Agenda and the New Urban Agenda. UN-Habitat works with diverse partners at all levels to design, implement, monitor and evaluate its policies and programmes. A partnership strategy aligned with the strategic plan has been developed to enhance stakeholder engagement in all aspects of its work, building on a Stakeholder Collaborative Implementation Framework (SCIF), which aims to enhance collaboration, and co-creation of projects and programmes and foster enduring partnerships. The Stakeholder Collaborative Implementation Framework (SCIF) aims to strengthen partnerships and stakeholder engagement to generate a shared value-creation of all actors of the city. The framework focuses on four approaches that guide on areas of engagement: monitoring and reporting on implementation of SDGs; engagement in UN-Habitat's intergovernmental processes; joint programming; and advocacy. Implementation of the SCIF will contribute to effective delivery of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, its commitment to human rights towards achievement of the urban related SDGs and related targets; and respond to -culture and innovation; social inclusion and ending poverty; sustainable and inclusive urban prosperity and opportunities for all; and environmental sustainability and resilience. The SCIF also supports the implementation of the Partnerships Strategy and will guide the agency in responding the recommendations made by stakeholders who attended the stakeholder forum during the UN-Habitat Assembly, May 2019 in Nairobi. This event provides an opportunity to stakeholders to critically review stakeholder collaboration and engagement mechanisms within the context of SCIF and develop practical measures to generate practical actions. Stakeholders will guide UN-Habitat in what works and what doesn't work for maximum impact.
