Localizing the SDGs through PPP in Smart Cities: Lessons learned from Asia to the world

### Summary

This event will share many examples from various countries and cities, which are aiming at localizing the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) through Public-Private Partnership (PPP). The podium and floor discuss together comprehensive solutions and measures for smart cities with attention to needs and challenges in each city. “Smart cities” are supposed to contribute to solving urban problems by mobilizing innovation toward localization of the SDGs. Innovation such as AI and automation may bring a great change to our daily lives and policy making tools including territorial and urban planning. Toward a human-centered and sustainable society i.e. “Society 5.0”, countries are moving forward with smart cities as a new principle of territorial and urban planning to make cities more sustainable and inclusive for the future, with strong collaboration among academics, public and private sectors. Since urban problems present a great variety among countries and cities, there is no one-size-fits-all. For knowledge sharing and mutual-learning, there is increasing collaboration among smart cities such as ASEAN Smart City Network (ASCN). In addition Japan Association for Smart Cities in ASEAN (JASCA) was established in September 2019 by mobilizing the public and private sectors to cooperate with ASEAN in the development of smart cities. This public and private sector collaboration is composed of seven Japanese ministries, more than 200 private companies from different sectors including manufacturing, real estate, civil engineering, and systems; public finance organizations such as JICA, JOIN, JICT, JBIC, and NEXI; public organizations with urban planning skills such as UR; as well as local governments. The session will enhance sharing of experiences and knowledge among various stakeholders, notably from ASCN, JASCA, private sectors (Members of Overseas Construction Association of Japan Inc.), and international organizations including UN-Habitat. Presentations will cover smart features in technology and innovation in urban development to localize SDGs through PPP in each Smart City, followed by panel and floor discussion. The event will provide a great opportunity to learn together through lively discussion among the panels and the audience, which will create global network from Asia and enhance global collaboration toward sustainable smart cities.
