SDGs monitoring at the city level, a multi-stakeholder effort

Summary

First, there will be a brief introduction of the Latin American context and public institution's work relating sustainable cities and public spaces. Three initiatives contributing to localizing SDGs in cities will be presented. One of them is the Citizen Observatory Lima Como Vamos which monitors urban quality of life through annual publications providing data and knowledge to build active citizenship; works alongside multiple stakeholders to have better policies for a more human and fair city; promotes small scale urban interventions in public space. Currently, Lima como vamos is undergoing a process of decentralization to escalate citizen movements at a national level. This presentation will be delivered by Mariana Alegre, Executive Director of Lima Cómo Vamos (Peru). Additionally, Jose Chong (UN-Habitat) will introduce the Public Spaces tools to localized SDGs, such as the Global Public Space Toolkit translated to Spanish in partnership with Tecnológico de Monterrey. The toolkit shares good practices around the globe for management and creation of public spaces. In addition, the Citizen-Led Public Space Interventions Manual, a publication produced in collaboration with Avina Foundation and Ocupa tu Calle will be presented. Finally, Alfredo Hidalgo (Tecnológico de Monterrey) will introduce how the importance of the interaction between academia and practice to localized SDGs at the city level.
