





Urban tourism: Policies and governance for more sustainable, inclusive, creative, and resilient cities

6 November 2024, Cairo, Egypt Preliminary Programme

Background & Objectives

Tourism is one of the world's key socioeconomic drivers. Prior to the pandemic, it was the third-largest export category globally and one of the world's leading employers, especially women, representing 54% of the workforce. Having been hard hit by COVID-19 the sector is now close to full recovery with many cities and countries already surpassing their 2019 tourism levels.

In recent years, tourism has also become an essential pillar in the development for many cities and regions, promoting income, jobs, the protection, and preservation of cultural and natural heritage, contributing to the development of cultural and creative sectors, and functioning as a catalyst for social inclusion and better living conditions for local communities.

If sustainable developed, tourism has the potential to advance urban infrastructure and universal accessibility, preserve cultural and natural assets, stimulate creative industries, promote the regeneration of neglected areas, enhance mobility, innovation, foster intercultural dialogue, eventually transforming cities in better places to visit and live.

Yet, alongside the various opportunities that tourism represents, its significant growth and structural changes has increased existing challenges and externalities for host territories and communities.

Within the context of the World Urban Forum, UN Tourism, UN Habitat, and UNESCO organize a high-level event to discuss how to build better polices and governance in tourism, emphasizing the role of culture and creativity, for more sustainable, inclusive, creative, and resilient cities.

The high-level discussion, open debate and exchange of good practices will foster collective knowledge on the actions and governance approaches necessary to optimize the positive effects of tourism in cities minimizing its externalities.

The event aims at creating a space that allows the identification of cross-cutting synergies and partnerships within and among cities, and across key stakeholders at all levels, encouraging public-private-community collaboration to help deliver solutions to urban tourism challenges.

As an outcome of this cooperation, the conclusions drawn from UN-Habitat/UN Tourism Expert Group Meeting on "Advancing Sustainable Urban Tourism: Developing tools for promoting good practices in cities and territories" will be presented. Likewise, recognizing the important role of culture as a driver of sustainable development of tourism in cities, a series of Urban Solutions "Culture-driven Sustainable Urban Tourism" led by UNESCO, in collaboration with UN Tourism and UN-Habitat, will be featured. These solutions will promote cultural understanding and sustainable growth, transforming tourism into a catalyst for positive change.
